Bingo Game Card Block

Materials for 1 (10 1/2") card:

Each fabric must be chosen from one of the following categories: batik, floral, geometric, heart, leaf, metallic, holiday, novelty, paisley, plaid, solid, star, stripe, or 1930s print. Use a black print for the center square.

5 (2 1/2") squares assorted yellow and orange prints

5 (2 1/2") squares assorted red prints

5 (2 1/2") squares assorted blue prints

5 (2 1/2") squares assorted green prints

4 (2 1/2") squares assorted pink and purple prints

1 (2 1/2") square black print

Block Assembly:

- 1. Join 5 yellow/orange print squares to make 1 row. In the same manner, make 1 red, 1 blue, and 1 green row.
- Join 2 pink/purple squares. Make 2 pink/purple pairs. Join one pink/purple pair to each side of the black square to complete pink/purple row.
- 3. Join rows, placing pink/purple row in center, to complete 1 Bingo Game Card block.

Bring your completed blocks to the next Quilt Guild Meeting.
