Orphan Quilt Blocks

Orphan Quilt Blocks are quilt blocks left over from a project or were test or practice blocks. They are also called: leftovers, part of a UFO, rejects, false starts, OOPS, re-do, that's a definite do-over, and what was I thinking?

Some ways orphan blocks can be used are by turning them into the following:

Pillow Wall hanging
Potholder/hot pad Tote bag
Pincushion Doll quilt
Center for Round Robin Table runner
Block for calendar squares Tea cozy
Sewing machine cover Book cover
Case for eyeglasses or rotary cutter
Pocket for sewing table, remotes or tote bag
Practice square for hand or machine quilting

And when you can't think of anything to do with them, you can sell them or give them away to a "friend" who will find a use for them.

Wanted: Fabric Angels - We would like to make May military month and in September we will be focusing on kid fabric. We are asking our members to bring in fabric for our Wounded Soldier Quilts. For those of you who have not been able to sew a wounded soldier quilt, here is your chance to be part of this important outreach program of our Guild. For each kit we need 1 yard light, 1 yard dark and 4 yards that will be used for the backing and binding. We have been making red, white and blue quilts, but have added browns, greens, creams and beiges. Floral fabrics will not work in our quilts.

Your halo would even be larger, if you could cut the 1 yard cuts into 6" squares. We will be collecting the fabric at our May Social. You are always welcome to bring your fabric in at anytime.

Retreat Coffee Cake Muffins

If you have been fortunate to attend one of Ann Ware's Quilting Retreats, then you have tasted one of these (or many, many of these).

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

1/2 cup slices almonds

2 teaspoons cinnamon

1 2/3 cup all-purpose flour

1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

3/4 cup butter, softened

1 1//4 cup sugar

3 eggs

Sprinkle with the brown sugar mixture. Spoon the

1 cup sour cream

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Preheat oven 325°. Spray 2—12-cup muffin pans with non-stick cooking spray or line with paper cups. In a small bowl combine brown sugar, almonds and cinnamon. In a medium bowl, combine flour, baking powder and baking soda. In a large bowl, beat the butter and sugar until fluffy. Add the eggs, one at a time. Add the flour mixture alternately with the sour cream. Stir in vanilla. Spoon half of the batter into the muffin cups.

remaining batter on top. Sprinkle with the remaining brown sugar mixture. Bake 24-30 minutes. Cool 10 minutes before removing from pan.

Cork	Silk flowers	Clothing labels
