Report from the Quilt Show Committee Meeting on January 29, 2018

- (1.) We started with a welcome and introduction of the nine people present.
- (2.) We discussed venues and dates for the 2019 Quilt Show. A motion was made and passed unanimously to hold the show at the Berglund Center (Roanoke Civic Center) on Friday and Saturday, March 29 and 30, 2019.
- (3.) Committee chair and co-chair positions were discussed and most slots filled or recommendations made. We plan to complete the final roster in February.
- (4.) We reviewed the 2017 show budget and compared projected and actual income and expenses. Using this information as a guide, a proposed budget of income and expenses for the 2019 Show was created. This budget will be considered by the Guild board, and when approved, presented to the Guild membership.
- (5.) Future Quilt Show committee meetings will be held on the third Tuesday of each month.
- (6.) Proposed topics for the next meeting were a theme for the show, potential judges, and vendors (potential vendors, cancellation policy, fees, and perks).

Avanté Quilt Machine for Sale



I have my long arm quilting / mid arm machine for sale. It is the Avanté by Handi Quilter. It has 18 inches of quilting space and will quilt up to a king-size quilt. It is in excellent condition.

I purchased this machine in 2010 for \$9995.00. The twelve-foot table that carries the machine comes with the machine. From the back of the machine you are able to do pantographs or from the front your own style quilting.

Extra accessories that I purchased are the following:

Bobbin Winder ... cost \$355.00

Ruler Base ... cost \$89.00 (now costs \$150). Use rulers to sew around or make straight lines.

Micro Handles ... cost \$350.00 These handles put you closer to your work.

Your price, including the extra accessories \$5,500.00
