The Star Quilters Guild Zoom meeting was called to order by President Bonnie Scott at 7:00 pm. We had a total of 44 members and visitors in attendance.

Program by Lyric Kinard "The Elements of Art for Every Quilter"

Lyric Kinard is an award winning, passionate artist and teacher. She has been recognized for her talents as the Teacher of the Year by the 2011 International Association of Professional Quilters. She is the author of the book "Art & Quilt: Design Principles and Creativity Exercises". She has written extensively for Quilting Arts Magazine, appeared on Quilting Arts TV and The Quilt Show. She is a musician; she's earned a BA in English Literature from the University of Utah and has formally studied architecture. She has five children and currently lives just 3 hours south of Roanoke in Cary, North Carolina with her husband.

Her program described the Elements of the Visual Language building blocks:

- 1. Texture A story your fingers can read with your eyes
- 2. Shape we create symbols with the shapes that mean something to us
- 3. Lines it takes the eye through a journey on the quilt
- 4. Color Color is personal, it is about relationships and emotions
- 5. Value creates dimension and gives the illusions of depth of a flat plane

Instead of copying a quilt exactly, she encouraged and challenged us to think about the elements that attracted you to that quilt. Find the element you love the most and instead of copying that quilt, use the elements that you love to create your own quilt.

This two workshop with Vickie Clontz is filled to the brim with several dyeing and felting techniques. Using non-toxic dyes students can try their hands on silk marbling, stenciling, ice dyeing, texturizing, and resist techniques.

On day 2 we will continue the dyeing processes as well as start on the layout of a unique fiber art piece. Wool bead, boro stitching and more will be demonstrated.

Two full days of creativity playtime await!!




Busy Hands will not be meeting in November and December. The group will start back up in January 2021. Continue working on your handwork projects.

"Scrappy 20 with a Twist in 2021" Guild Challenge

Challenge: Choose 10 fabrics of one type and 10 fabrics of another type, plus a background fabric of your choice, to make a quilt. Examples might be 10 darks + 10 lights, 10 reds + 10 blues, 10 stripes + 10 polka dots, 10 Christmas + 10 solids, 10 blacks + 10 whites, 10 fabrics bought years ago + 10 recent fabrics. The combinations are limited only by your imagination! After you reach the goal of 10 different fabrics of one type, you may use duplicates. Members are encouraged to trade scraps with each other if you need more variety.

<u>Design Twist:</u> Get out of your rut and try something new! **GO BOLD!!!** Try a different approach like a new style, colorway, or technique. Example: if you are a traditional quilter, try modern or art; if you lean to neutral colors, try vibrant; if you always piece, try applique.

Size: Any size from miniature to king

Construction: 3-layer quilt sandwich with binding and label

<u>Due:</u> April 2021 SQG meeting (month the 2021 Quilt Show would have been held)

It will not be judged but may be entered in an appropriate category in the 2023 Quilt Show with the addition of a hanging sleeve. ~Judy Coffman, Quilt Show Chair

DID YOU KNOW

Tips for Fabric Selection

You have selected your quilt project and you visit your local fabric shop to pick out your fabrics. The possibilities are overwhelming! Where to begin?

You can always ask for the advice of the quilt shop staff. However, you might want to give them a hint of what you like, such as selecting a print that you see on their shelf, or indicating that you want to include your favorite shade of purple.

Sometimes the theme of your project will guide your selection. For example, if your project is for a Fourth of July celebration or a Quilt of Valor, start with a patriotic-themed print plus red, white and blue, or fabrics that "read", or look like, red, white and blue from a distance. For example, your red might have small yellow stars or dots that are not really noticeable or distracting from 10 feet away.

Suppose your project uses a churn dash block. This can require three fabrics (center square, churn dash, and background), or two fabrics if you use the same fabric for background and the center block. One important consideration in this case is value, or light-dark contrast, so that your churn dash will "pop" or stand out. Light and dark are relative, so the same bright blue can be light next to black, or dark next to white. You could choose a medium-sized print (like the dragonfly fabric for Dawn Shaben's recent challenge) for your background and center block, and something solid or nearly solid and opposite value for the churn dash.

Quilt shop prints will normally have color dots on the selvage indicating the colors used in the print. You can use these color dots to help you choose accent fabrics.

Sometimes a quilt shop will stock several bolts from the same fabric collection consisting of a large print and smaller prints or solids designed to go with it. You could limit yourself to fabrics from the same collection, keeping in mind the light-dark value of what you choose. When choosing a print for your project, consider the size of the pieces you will be using in your project. For example, if you need four-inch squares, a uniformly distributed small or medium print (the fabric for Ann Ware's recent challenge is an example) will produce squares which look very similar, but a print with a lot of "background" or solid-reading area might produce a lot of mostly-solid squares. Of course you could do a lot of "fussy-cutting" to get squares which include less background, which requires extra fabric.

Finally, if your fabric selection pleases you, it is perfect!


