A Valentine's Tale about a Goodwill Quilt and a Mother's Love

Loretta Bedia started the story: "Raf and I were shopping at the Brambleton Goodwill on the day after Valentine's Day," she says, "and a red and white Log Cabin quilt caught my eye. I walked away and checked out a few more things. I was still drawn to the quilt, though. I took it off the hanger, spread it out, and saw that it was in great shape and hand-quilted."

Loretta purchased the quilt and took it home. She had noticed that in the corner was an embroidered name and date, "Susan Yeager Eighty Four."

Two of her friends in the Star Quilters Guild had that name -- David and Cynthia Yeager. So she texted Cynthia and asked if her husband David had a relative named Susan Yeager.

Cynthia told Loretta, "Yes. His mom." Them she added, "She passed away this morning."

Loretta sent her a photo of the quilt and the name in the corner. Cynthia was amazed. "I've never seen that one. She must have gifted it to someone.

"We were stunned at the timing! Loretta found it on the very day that we needed it most. She brought the quilt to us on Wednesday. It was in very good shape (38 years later) and we can only assume that someone else passed away and their family donated the quilt. Susan gave many quilts to Sunday School friends and made dozens of raffle quilts over the years.

"Oh my goodness, if that's not a sign David is doing EXACTLY what he should be doing ... Wow."

Loretta says, "The quilt is now living with its rightful owner."

Cynthia told me, "I just thought the whole story was something we should share with the guild. A reminder to put a label on your quilts ... and never doubt that you are making a difference in someone's life. It came full circle for us on a very emotional day."

Tips for Cleaning Cutting Mats

Over time, a cutting mat can develop grooves where the cutter blade ran over it -even when you've been careful to turn the board and not always cut in the same place!
An old toothbrush will clean fabric out of these grooves. To clean out bits of batting,
try a white pencil eraser.

Minutes of the Star Quilters Guild Meeting on February 7, 2022

We met at our usual place, Christ Lutheran Church. President Dawn Schaben called our meeting to order at 7:01 PM. Dawn welcomed us and introduced herself. Dawn then called on Judy McWhorter, who announced the recent passing of previous Guild member Don Bunce, who served as President 2006-2008 and made many beautiful, award-winning quilts. A Celebration of Life in his honor will be held at a later date.

Business Meeting

Comfort Quilts: Ethel Simmons reported that a total of 23 completed quilts were turned in recently.

Publicity: Sarah Baumgardner arranged for an article about our 40th Anniversary Celebration that was published in a recent issue of the Roanoke Times magazine. A copy of the article was passed around.

Library: Kathy Wickham announced that the library is open! Stickers are being added to classify books by type: applique, modern, etc.

Membership: Jennifer Adams reported that 50 members, one new member, and three guests were signed in for the meeting.

Hospitality: Gisela O'Connor announced the February birthdays.

Special Events: Cathy Russell announced there is still one opening for the Guild's retreat; \$280 covers the cost of lodging, food, and sewing space. A road trip to the Lancaster, PA area is planned for April 7 through April 10. Van transportation and lodging are included in the cost of the trip. See Cathy to sign up for these events.

Newsletter: A volunteer is needed to serve as editor. Anyone interested in that job, or in helping on any of the guild committees, should tell Dawn Schaben.

Row by Row Quilts: Sue Berry announced that it is not too late to sign up for one or both of the ongoing row-of-the-month projects. There is no penalty for working ahead or for not completing a row in its assigned month; the goal is to have a completed quilt top at our December social.

Programs: Our March program will be a presentation by several members on the topic "What I Wish I Had Known," based on their quilting experiences.

Nominating Committee: The committee (Karen McMillan, Kathy Wickham, Cathy Russell) announced the slate of candidates for our upcoming election: Dawn Schaben, President; Sue Berry, Vice President; Becky Foster, Treasurer; and Claire Hightower, Secretary.

Ways and Means: We spent \$297.35 at our sales tables, giving our Ways and Means committee two empty tubs to take home.

Other: Karen Taylor announced that the Lake Quilters Quilt Show will be held April 29 and April 30 at Bethlehem United Methodist Church in Moneta.

Guild member Barbara Zubler presented a hands-on program to create a Happy Village based on a book by Karen Eckmeier. Barbara's experience teaching quilting

classes was evident. She had prepared fabric kits for us in advance, and she had small quilts and photos to show us examples of how we could proceed. We cut up our fabrics and glued them to the eight inch square of feature fabric in our kit to make houses with roofs, doors, steps and shrubbery to create our village. What fun! Closing

Members of Blue Ridge Quilters showed two opportunity quilts created for the National Quilt Day Celebration on March 5. The event will include a display of quilts, a national speaker, lunch, and drawings for the winners of these quilts. We also enjoyed Show and Tell by our members.
